

# Markdown Basics

This document demonstrates the basic features of Markdown.

## Headings

Headings are created using # symbols. More # means smaller headings.

**This is a Level 3 Heading**

**This is a Level 4 Heading**

**This is a Level 5 Heading**

**This is a Level 6 Heading**

## Text Formatting

You can make text **bold** using double asterisks or **double underscores**.

You can make text *italic* using single asterisks or *single underscores*.

You can combine them for ***bold and italic*** text.

You can also use ~~striketrough~~ with double tildes.

## Lists

### Unordered Lists

- Item one
- Item two
  - Nested item A
  - Nested item B
- Item three

### Ordered Lists

1. First item
2. Second item
  1. Sub-item one
  2. Sub-item two
3. Third item

## Blockquotes

This is a blockquote. It can span multiple lines.

Nested blockquotes are also possible.

## Code

Inline code uses backticks.

Code blocks use triple backticks:

```
function hello() {  
  console.log("Hello, World!");  
}
```

## Horizontal Rules

Three or more dashes create a horizontal rule:

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## Tables

| Column 1 | Column 2 | Column 3 |
|----------|----------|----------|
| Left     | Center   | Right    |
| Aligned  | Aligned  | Aligned  |
| Data     | Data     | Data     |
